




THE SDGs: A DEVELOPMENT AGENDA FOCUSED ON FIVE "Ps"

- People: end poverty and hunger, in all their forms and dimensions, ensure dignity and equality and a healthy environment
- Planet: protect the planet from degradation, including through sustainable consumption and production, sustainably managing its natural resources and taking urgent action on climate change
- Prosperity: all human beings must enjoy prosperous and fulfilling lives and economic, social and technological progress occurs in harmony with nature
- Peace: fostering peaceful, just and inclusive societies which are free from fear and violence
- Partnership: mobilize the means required to implement this agenda through a revitalized Global Partnership for Sustainable Development




