







- Youth are served by adults and have to input into program and decision making
- Youth input into program decision making is occasionally solicited by adult workers
- •Youth provide regular input into program decision making
- •Youth have substantive, meaningful roles in leadership positions, including governance and programming
- Youth fill a majority of positions and manage day-today operations of program
- Youth are in all major leadership roles and have majority membership with appropriate support adult allies

Amani Aruri & Ryan Crowley





Amani Aruri is passionate about linking, improving, and increasing support to women and youth peacebuilders and increasing young people's pro-social civic engagement and democratic participation, particularly in a high-risk contexts. She holds a master's degree in Economics from Birzeit University and has utilized her skills in managing innovative programs that serve marginalized groups especially youth and women in Palestine, with a special focus on gender issues in the Palestinian society. She was elected for the Youth Local Council of Eastern Bani Zaid in Palestine, a member of the assembly of the UN Women gender innovation program-AGORA, and a member of the Global Youth Task Force on Beijing 25, and recently was selected as a member of task force on the Generation Equality Compact on Women, Peace and security and Humanitarian Action.



Ryan is the Deputy Wales Lead for the Future Leaders Network. Since he started volunteering with his local youth forum in Merthyr Tydfil, eventually becoming its Chair, it has become Ryan's goal to devote his life to the inspiration and empowerment of young people. Over the last 3 years, Ryan has aimed towards enhancing the potential of young people, whether it be through the youth ambassador scheme with Public Health Wales, acting as a Wales representative for the British Irish Parliamentary Assembly, or in his current post as Deputy Wales Lead for FLN. Ryan has been guided in his work by his unmoving support in the Wellbeing of Future Generations Act, and the UNCRC, particularly Article 12 which guarantees that all young people have a right to a voice in all public decisions, no matter how big or small.

Yvette is a passionate youth leadership enthusiast with an academic background in Nutrition and Food Science, who as strategically transferred her skillset to the world of your and volunteerism since she joined AIESEC in 2016. She has four years of active participation in youth development and empowerment; tackling the SDGs towards economic empowerment. AIESEC is the largest youth led organization in the world, present in 120 countries and territories. Currently, she serves as the Regional Manager for Business Development for Middle East and Africa, managing partnerships and collaborating with organizations that work with AIESEC. Prior to this, she served as the Country Director for AIESEC in Tanzania. Yvette joined the IAVE International Board of Directors in 2020.



During her years of experience, Her Excellency Hessa Tahlak held prominent positions in different government, semi-private, and nonprofit organizations. Her roles varied from strategic planning, research and studies, marketing, development, and community service. HE Hessa currently holds the position of Assistant Undersecretary of Social Development at the Ministry of Community Development, and Chief Innovation Officer. Of her most notable achievements during her time at MOCD, she founded a volunteerism axis within the ministry, alongside execution of projects pertaining to The Year of Giving which included 13 projects, policies, and laws. In addition, she is a member on the board of directors of Dubai Foundation for Women and Children and the Emirates Gender Balance Council.
