Giselle Mendez is a Volunteer Innovator and Founder/Managing Director of The Volunteer Center of Trinidad & Tobago (VCTT). VCTT hosts a unique Caribbean-based platform which connects people to high impact custom built interventions which support the SDGs. VCTT believes in the transformational power of people, and curate an all-inclusive space for citizens to be activated and meaningfully engaged in pioneering viable solutions, in support of our Vision of 'A Volunteer In Every Home'. Their interventions include the Me to We E-Mentorship program, the Grown in East Port of Spain home & community garden initiative and the development of a regional network for volunteerism.



Deedar Guerra has been a volunteer since 2009, the year he founded a CBO called ADDESSO. In 2015, he began an active collaboration in the revitalization of National Volunteering Council of the Mozambique (CNV), where he serves as the Vice President. At CNV he has led the design of CNV plans and projects, as well as the coordination of their implementation at national level, ensuring the mobilization and management of volunteers. He is the of the volunteer scheme mentor in Mozambique. He has led the CNV's cooperation with foreign entities, having led its affiliation to platforms internationally.



Padmasini Dayananda is the CSR Outreach Lead for Cognizant UK and Continental Europe. Her primary focus is to bridge the opportunity gap through social digital empowerment; delivering digital education to a spectrum ranging from primary schools, youth employability initiatives and pro bono services to charities, advising them on how they can use digital capabilities to service their beneficiary better. The Social Digital Empowerment Program won the employee engagement award for social responsibility in 2019. In January 2019, Padmasini won the CSR Excellence Award UK for the impact delivered through Outreach.
